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# CHC33021 Certificate III in Individual Support

 Intake Date: Monthly

 Duration: 52 weeks inclusive of term break and public holiday



## Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of individuals in the community, home or residential care setting who work under supervision and delegation as a part of a multi-disciplinary team, following an individualised plan to provide person-centred support to people who may require support due to ageing, disability or some other reason.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least **120 hours of work placement** as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of the units of competency.

## Entry Requirements

## Course Description

Workers may be required to demonstrate leadership and have limited responsibility for the organisation within limited parameters.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least **120 hours of work** as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of the units of competency.
